

## License and Third-Party Support Requirements

In order to use OpenMail you need to purchase OpenMail Mailbox Licenses (P/N B2016BZ). To use HP Clients, you need to additionally purchase HP Client Licenses (P/N B2020BZ). To use OpenMail Application Link, you need to purchase Application Link Client Licenses (P/N B2029BZ) and OpenMail Mailbox Licenses.

### **Application Link Client Licenses**

To use Application Link you will require an "Application Link" client license (B2029BZ) and an "OpenMail Mailbox" license (B2016BZ). You will need sufficient Application Link client licenses and mailbox licenses for the maximum number of applications that will be signed on to OpenMail at any one time. Application Link licenses are supplied individually for each concurrent instance of each application used.

In addition, to use the Assured Delivery Service feature of the Application Link Server, you will require an additional Application Link Client license and one mailbox license for each instance of this service. The Assured Delivery Service ensures messages are delivered in the order in which they were sent.

### Microsoft Client Licenses

To use the Outlook MAPI Service Providers for OpenMail customers will require:

- B2016BZ "OpenMail Mailbox" license from HP
- B2275BZ OpenMail Outlook driver license (pack of 50 licenses to use) from HP, plus
- the appropriate outlook client license which may be purchased from Microsoft.

## **Lotus Client Licenses**

To be able to use the Lotus cc:Mail R6 client (OpenMail Edition), customers will require

- B2016BZ "OpenMail Mailbox" license from HP
- B2274BZ OpenMail cc:Mail R6 driver license (pack of 50 licenses to use) from HP, plus
- the appropriate client license which may be purchased from Lotus:
  - o cc:Mail for Windows R6
  - o cc:Mail Mobile for Windows R6
